She dealt with major investment projects also in the nuclear sector (ie Chernobyl Shelter Fund and Nuclear Safety Account).

She started working in FORATOM in June 2004. Since then she has been in charge of the radioactive waste management and decommissioning financing issues, transport of RAM and all questions related to legal aspects. In May 2012, she started as an Executive Advisor to the FORATOM Director General and is in charge, in this capacity, of the General Assembly and the Executive Board, as well as relations with the FORATOM members. She is also responsible for analysing and informing of the consequences of Brexit for the nuclear industry.
